Soccer Tryouts are Trying for Everyone

by a dad from "On the Pitch"

I read a comment recently that got me thinking about tryouts for select teams and how they are often perceived by parents:
To the clubs it's all a number, to the child waiting at home it's personal.

There is no question that tryouts can be a very stressful and difficult time for kids. Those trying out for a select team for the first time wonder if they are good enough, those that are returning have bonded with teammates and coaches and want to return to a team they hold dear. When the call doesn't come or a child doesn't make the team they hoped to, it is easy to get angry at the league and the people you know helped form the teams. It is easy and probably comforting to think that it really is just a number to those involved.

But as one of those involved in selecting teams, I can tell you for many it probably is much more personal. League officers are often dedicated volunteers who do what they do because they love kids, the game of soccer, and helping young athletes develop.

When you're tasked with helping to evaluate and select players for the 'top teams', it's a stressful responsibility. Personally, I find it the most stressful time of the year. Sure, it's easy to place 95% of the kids, but it's those last few, who all scored very close to each other, and you only have one spot left. In small and mid sized leagues, it's next to impossible not to know some of them. Heck, many may have coached them at one time or another.

So, yes, there may be leagues that manage to treat everything as a number, but I'm sure it's less common than many believe. I'm sure I'm not the only one who stresses over it, questioning decisions, wondering what if, dreading the next time they encounter a player who didn't make a team.

So if your child doesn't get that slot they wanted, it's OK to be upset - but before you consider directing any ire at the people tasked with making those hard decisions - put yourself in their shoes, having to make decisions about kids they've known since they were 4, children of neighbors, and possibly friends. It has to be done, but I doubt you'll find many league officials who enjoy tryout week and the selection process that follows. So keep that in mind when tryout results are announced. It's likely a lot of debate and soul-searching went into some of those decisions.

Columbus Crew and our Affiliation with an MLS Franchise

During our winter meetings some great questions came up in regard to our long term commitment to the Columbus Crew organization and their commitment to us. Let us try to explain this relationship, short and long term by starting with some history.

The Columbus Crew is owned and operated by the Hunt Group, founded and directed by the Lamar Hunt family. Yes, the same man who started the American Football League (AFL) helped found the MLS, and he has the US Open Soccer Cup named after him, The Lamar Hunt Cup. Besides our affiliate, the Hunt Group also owns NFL's Kansas City Chiefs and MLS's FC Dallas.

Knowing how much smaller the sports market is in Columbus compared to other metropolitan areas like New York, Los Angeles and Chicago, the Hunt group had to think "outside the box" to make sure they had an edge both in fan base and player development. One way to do that was to build the first ever soccer specific stadium in the US that was completed in 1999, right in time for the US to host FIFA's women's World Cup. Another way to set themselves apart was to develop a close relationship with university programs and their coaching staffs early. This brought in soccer-specific people to the Crew organization right away and provided a local feel to the team on the pitch.

Smaller markets also many times mean smaller budgets and less money to buy marquis players. The Crew recognized this and was on the forefront of local player development to "feed" into the local universities and then on to professional life for the few who made it that far.

As the MLS announced the "player development program" three years ago, the Crew organization was ready with a structure that was already being build and transitioned easily into the program. The MLS has very specific restrictions on this program in regard to "home territories" and "home grown players." The Crew can only establish Crew Juniors programs within the state of Ohio and have two "Regional Partners" outside the state. The Grand Rapids Crew Juniors is the only Regional Partner to date. In Ohio, there are now Crew Juniors programs in Columbus and Cleveland, with Cincinnati being added this fall.

Moving into the benefits of this relationship for our organization and our players, let us start with the people we deal with on a daily basis from the Columbus Crew:

We currently have weekly briefings with their VP of Business Development and Director of Crew Juniors, along with the club's Technical Director who oversees the Senior Team (Hejduk and Co.) and talent development. These briefings will begin to include other Crew Juniors organizations and become more of a coaches' briefing with technical information and alignment of our training curriculums among all Crew Juniors clubs.

The concept is still very young, and as we go forward our early relationship with the Crew Juniors program is helping us shape it into a great partnership, not only with Columbus but with other Crew Juniors clubs in Ohio.

Specifically, the Grand Rapids Crew Juniors are seeing some great benefits on the pitch already. We were represented last year in Colorado when the Columbus Crew sent a U17 team to the first ever U17 MLS Cup to compete with other MLS U17 squads and were scouted heavily by many D1 universities. The same thing will take place this summer.

Very talented GRCJ players will also have a chance to be selected to the Crew Soccer

Academy (CSA) which has U16 and U18 teams compete in the USSF Academy program. The CSA is one of only two programs in the country that provides this nine month league at no cost. Players are selected strictly based on their talents and not on whether they can afford it or not. For the players who qualify for the CSA Academy the pay-offs can be tremendous, as every game is being scouted by various university coaches and the league is run by the US National team coaching staff.

For all of our players the relationship with the Crew organization means an affiliation where they can identify with the true professionals in the sport. It gives our kids the chance to go to Columbus twice a year to see a professional game and experience training sessions organized by the Crew coaching staff. They will get a tour of the stadium, be on the pitch when the players warm up and some of our kids will have a chance to play a warm-up game before the professionals take the pitch.

You will also find Columbus Crew staff helping us up here in Grand Rapids at MVP once a year during our team camps which are normally in August (for 2008 - the week of August 11th). Additionally we hope to add a winter clinic in the future that will include Crew staff. In the immediate future you will get the opportunity to see the "Crew Tour" during our try-outs in June. It is the traveling Columbus Crew "Circus" that is normally used on game day in Columbus.

As we move forward you will find our relationship with the Crew organization get even closer as our coaches will be presented with more training and continued education to include the latest in coaching methods at both the select and premier level. This will help us attract the best coaches in the state and provide us the opportunity to give the players and parents a learning environment that is second to none.

We are committed to long-term player development through our MLS affiliation and plan on the relationship with the Crew lasting a long, long time. To experience the benefit of our Crew connection, join our club in going to Columbus for a Crew game and clinic over the weekend of June 28th and 29th. The game tickets and clinic are free and the hotel is at a discounted rate. We look forward to seeing you there!

GRCJ's Taylor Mazurek's Trip to Spain

Trip to Spain an eye-opener — Brighton teen gets education as part of ODP tour

Taylor Mazurek makes a habit of traveling a long way to play soccer.

The 14-year-old Brighton freshman regularly travels to Grand Rapids — sometimes as many as three times per week — to practice and play for the Grand Rapids Crew Juniors club team.

His most recent soccer trip, however, makes the drive to Grand Rapids seem like a joy ride. In late February, Mazurek traveled to Barcelona, Spain, as part of the United States Olympic Development Program.

"It was amazing," Mazurek said of the nine-day trip. "Everybody that you see has such a high skill level and the style they play over there is way different than we play here."

The ODP is a program created by the United States Youth Soccer Association which identifies and trains talented soccer players for the next level, specifically World Cup and Olympic competition. Mazurek is one of just 17 players — and one of four from Michigan — that was selected to the 1993-birth-year USODP Region 2 team. The region is made up of 14 Midwestern states. To make the team, players had to first try out for and make a district team and a state team before finally getting a chance to make the regional team. Mazurek's team played four games against top international competition, posting a 1-1-2 record.

While the trip was primarily about soccer, Mazurek said he and his teammates had plenty of free time as well.

"We got to go sight seeing and shopping, which we did a lot," Mazurek said. "We also got to go to the Barcelona-Levante game (Feb. 24). On (Feb. 26) we went to Barcelona and saw a bunch of historic buildings and they ended it by taking us to Nou Camp Stadium and we got to take a tour."

Despite all his experiences off the pitch, it was on the field where Mazurek enjoyed himself the most. "It was by far playing the games," Mazurek said when asked about his favorite part of the trip. "It was an amazing experience to see what is really out there. It shows why (the United States) doesn't really excel in soccer. Over in those countries, soccer is life. Everybody is good and they have so many players to choose from."

Mazurek's coach with the Grand Rapids Crew Juniors, Remco Bergsma, believes the experience of playing overseas will be beneficial to Mazurek. "Going and seeing how soccer is played in Europe is a really big thing," Bergsma said. "Here in America, the competition is not always so strong. Over there, everybody plays soccer. While here the top athletes have so many sports from which to choose, over there all the top athletes play soccer."

According to Mazurek, you never had to look far to see the game's influence. "When you're walking, you'll see groups of people playing in the street or on a field, or somebody juggling a ball," he said. "Most stores that you go to, there's at least a rack of jerseys. It really shows the love they have for soccer."

That passion for the game made Mazurek feel like he fit right in. "It kind of felt like being home," he said. "It felt like a place I could probably live because they love

soccer so much."

That, in fact, is the end goal for Mazurek, who one day hopes to play professional soccer. "It's always been a drive of his to play professionally," said Taylor's father Steve, who played collegiate soccer at the University of Toledo. Taylor's trip to Barcelona helped give him some perspective on just what it will take to play at the highest level. "If I want to look to play in Europe, I have a great idea of what I need to do," he said. "It's going to be really, really tough. It's going to be extremely tough to make an MLS team or pro team in the United States."

Still, Bergsma believes Mazurek certainly stacks up favorably against the best 14-year-olds in the country.

"Within his team, he's got a couple of players that are at that level and it's a national team level," Bergsma said. "If you compare him to what's out there in North America — we have played against all the big teams in the country — there's not a player that is better than him.

"He's quite smart with how he plays. He really understands the game, and that's a big part of being a good soccer player. Of course, when you get to the level he's at, you need to have some natural gifts. He's really fast and really strong."
