Player Fee Payment Policy

1. For those players electing to pay their fees via the GRCJ sanctioned payment plan and are not in the process of applying for Player Assistance, the first installment (“registration fee”) is due at Tryouts (for premier/MRL) or Player Registration Night (for select) or when the player gets registered. Those players who fail to pay their first installment will not be registered with their team, the club or the state organization.
2. For those players applying for Player Assistance, they are expected to pay the first installment (“registration fee”) at the time of Registration, and the player must pay the cost of the uniform (as determined by GRCJ) at the time of ordering online.
3. For those players electing to pay their fees via the GRCJ sanctioned payment plan, the players’ parent MUST fill out and sign the “Auto Charge Authorization and Payment Policy” before the player will get registered. This includes giving the club a credit card number and expiration date, as back-up, if the parent plans to pay the scheduled installments via checks. If the parent chooses not to give the credit card information as back-up in this case, then full payment will be required.
4. Following are the procedures for those families who fall behind in their scheduled payments:
 - a. Payments more than 15 days late (whether lack of payment, bounced checks, or declined debit or credit payments) results in an e-mail or phone call to you as a reminder.
 - b. Payments more than 30 days late will result in an additional e-mail, phone call or letter from the club.
 - c. The board reserves the right to pull player cards of those players whose families who are not in good financial standing with the club. Once payments are made and the accounts are up to date, player cards will be reinstated.
5. Please note that exceptions to the above stated policy can be made, of course, as long as the parent takes the initiative to contact the club and an agreement is worked out between the family and the GRCJ Board of Directors. GRCJ wants each and every player to have the opportunity to play, but it is the club’s duty to remain financially viable and cover its costs.
